We have advertised for years in the Winola news due to the nature of our businesses and our local presence. Our Construction business was formed in 2003 and since then we have built houses, garages, additions, decks and retaining walls around the lake. In 2010 we formed a dock building division called DockWorks and have completed many dock and boathouse projects at the lake. After years of advertising our construction and dock building business in the Winola News we focused our advertising on our Landscape Supply Yard Division which began 5 years ago. Located on Rt 6&11 in Dalton we sell Mulch, Gravel, Decorative stone, Topsoil, Firewood and many other products to wholesale and retail customers. We have many customers at Lake Winola and the close proximity to our yard makes sense for us to support the LWCA and promote this Division every year.

One service we offer that I feel many lake residents may not be aware of is our Winter dock bubbler program. It's a seasonal service where we actually set up and install customer bubblers in the Fall, check on them throughout the course of the Winter to ensure they are running properly, then remove them in the Spring and store them at our shop. For a very reasonable fee you never have to deal with your bubbler again! Great for snowbirds and out of towners. We also sell bubblers, thermostats and other associated supplies. 


## Garbage Pick up

You can reduce your risk of skin damage and skin cancer by seeking shade under an umbrella, tree, or other shelter before you need relief from the sun. The sun's ultraviolet (UV) rays can damage your skin in as little as 15 minutes. Follow these recommendations to help protect yourself and your family.

Sunscreen Put on broad spectrum sunscreen with at least SPF 15 before you go outside, even on slightly cloudy or cool days. Don't forget to put a thick layer on all parts of exposed skin. Get help for hard-to-reach places like your back. And remember, sunscreen works best when combined with other options to prevent UV damage.

How sunscreen works. Most sunscreen products work by absorbing, reflecting, or scattering sunlight. They contain chemicals that interact with the skin to protect it from UV rays. All products do not have the same ingredients; if your skin reacts badly to one product, try another one or call a doctor.

SPF. Sunscreens are assigned a sun protection factor (SPF) number that rates their effectiveness in blocking UV rays. Higher numbers indicate more protection. You should use a broad spectrum sunscreen with at least SPF 15.

Reapplication. Sunscreen wears off. Put it on again if you stay out in the sun for more than two hours and after swimming, sweating, or toweling off.

Expiration date. Check the sunscreen's expiration date. Sunscreen without an expiration date has a shelf life of no more than three years, but its shelf life is shorter if it has been exposed to high temperatures.

Cosmetics. Some makeup and lip balms contain some of the same sun-protective ingredients used in sunscreens. If they do not have at least SPF 15, be sure to use other forms of protection as well, such as sunscreen and a wide-brimmed hat.





## "THE LITTLE ORGANIZATION THAT COULD"



It all started in 1995 with a suggestion that there be no motorboats and jet skis on Sunday mornings until 11:00am. The idea met with an overwhelming positive response. Sunday mornings became full of kayakers, canoers, sailers and those who appreciate the lake as it was (way back when).

The L.W.C.A petitioned the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission to make this regulation specific to Lake Winola. In 1999 they adopted the regulation that 'approved a slow, minimum height swell speed on Lake Winola. Wyoming County from sunrise until 11:00am on Sunday mornings during the period from Memorial Day until Labor Day'. This means Slow-No-Wake.

This regulation enforced by the L.W.C.A and Fish and Boat Commission is one we continue to value. Sunday morning take out your canoe, kayak, paddle board, or sail boat and enjoy the lake's beauty! Remember it was not just one person who made a difference on Sunday mornings, it was the combined effort of many L.W.C.A members to make it happen!
